#### *Delisting from Hazardous Sites List*

Ecology is proposing to remove the Benton City Maintenance Yard site from the Hazardous Sites List. The Site is currently ranked a "3" on the list. Sites can be ranked from "1" to "5." A rank of "1" is the highest level of environmental concern compared to other sites on the list, and a rank of "5" is the lowest.

This Site is the location of a former Benton City maintenance facility. In December 1991, three underground storage tanks were removed. Sampling results showed gasoline and diesel contamination above state cleanup levels in the soil.

In September 1992, 500 cubic yards of soil was over-excavated around the locations of the three underground storage tanks. Over 100 cubic yards of contaminated soil was taken to the Richland landfill for remediation. Soil samples taken from the bottom and sides of the excavation showed no contamination above state cleanup levels.

Based on sampling results and the cleanup completed, Ecology has determined the site does not pose a threat to human health or the environment. Therefore, Ecology proposes to issue a determination of No Further Action and remove the site from the Hazardous Sites List.

#### *Draft Cleanup Action Plan*

The U.S. Navy has completed the draft final Cleanup Action Plan (CAP) for Operable Unit C (OU C) at Naval Base Kitsap at Bremerton and is now ready to finalize the CAP. The purpose of this plan is to make sure that the cleanup solutions for the site continue to be protective of human health and the environment. The CAP has information on monitoring data for OU C groundwater sampling from 2002 to present. An Operable Unit is a management unit or area with similar contaminants that is designated for cleanup.

OU C is located in the north-central portion of Naval Base Kitsap, north of Decatur Avenue and northwest of Coghlan Road. Commercial and residential properties are located north, west and east and shipyard operations are located south of OUC in the Controlled Industrial Area (CIA) of the Puget Sound Naval Shipyard.

OU C is contaminated with total petroleum hydrocarbons (TPH) that are associated with the operation of former petroleum storage tank 317. Tank 317 was a concrete storage tank constructed in 1919 and was used to store No. 6 Fuel Oil, Bunker C. This fuel is technically any type of fuel oil used aboard ships. It gets its name from the containers (known as Bunker Tanks) on ships and in ports that it is stored in, called bunkers. Since No. 6 is the most common, “bunker fuel” is often used as a synonym for No. 6. No. 6 oil is very persistent, and does not degrade rapidly. Its viscosity and stickiness also make it very difficult to remediate underground contamination.

The Navy is now ready to finalize the CAP. This includes ongoing groundwater monitoring, institutional controls and groundwater sampling to continue the monitoring wells. The monitoring data shows that the TPH contamination is not flowing into the Sinclair Inlet.

### *Enforcement Order Issued*

Ecology has issued an enforcement order to Lilyblad Petroleum for the Lilyblad Site. The enforcement order requires Lilyblad to implement the Cleanup Action Plan (CAP) at the site. The site has contamination of volatile and semi-volatile organic compounds and petroleum hydrocarbons in the soil and groundwater. The contamination came from releases from past petroleum handling and solvent recycling practices on the Lilyblad property. In the CAP, Ecology selects in-situ treatment technology to actively treat the soil and groundwater contaminants.

### *Agreed Order to Clean Up Petroleum and Metals Contamination*

Ecology and Union Oil Company of California (Unocal) have entered into a legal agreement called an Agreed Order that will require Unocal to continue cleanup of petroleum and metals contamination from the Unocal Edmonds Bulk Fuel Terminal Site. Unocal is a subsidiary of Chevron Corporation.

Contamination at the site consists primarily of petroleum related products. There is also limited metals contamination from sand blast grit used to clean equipment. Several interim actions have already been conducted to clean up portions of the site. The Agreed Order includes a work plan for conducting an interim action that is expected to complete the cleanup of the site. The action is an “interim action” (that is, not a final action), because monitoring must be conducted to assess whether the cleanup actions have been sufficient to protect groundwater or whether additional cleanup actions are required.

The Agreed Order includes an interim action work plan, which describes the work to be conducted and is included as Exhibit B of the Agreed Order.

The interim action will:

- Excavate all soil with metals contamination exceeding Ecology's cleanup level. This will be protective of direct contact with the soil (such as ingestion) and protective of groundwater.
- Excavate all soil with petroleum contamination exceeding safe levels for direct contact. Excavation of this soil is anticipated to be protective of groundwater.
- Conduct monitoring to assess whether petroleum concentrations in soil remaining on site are in fact protective of groundwater. If necessary, additional cleanup actions will be taken.
- Excavate contaminated sediment in Willow Creek.

The primary excavation work will occur in the summer and fall of 2007. Sediment in Willow Creek will be excavated in 2008. Groundwater monitoring will be conducted for a two-year period to gather and evaluate data to determine whether petroleum concentrations in soil remaining on site after excavation are protective of groundwater. The data collection period is from Fall 2007 until Fall 2009. An evaluation of the data is anticipated to be completed in the first half of 2010.

Once the interim action is complete, needed further work will be identified to complete the cleanup actions to be taken at the site. There will be a further opportunity for the public to comment on the work at that time.

A Remedial Investigation Report and Supplemental Remedial Investigation Report also are available for review.

*Proposed Removal From the Hazardous Sites List*

In January 2003, nearly 3,200 gallons of diesel was released on the BNSF track near the southern part of the town of Marcus in Stevens County. The release occurred on the hillside about 250 feet above and 200-300 feet south of State Route 25. A train hit a rock that had fallen on the tracks, and diesel leaked from three of the locomotive fuel tanks.

BNSF responded to the spill and nearly 180 cubic yards of petroleum contaminated soil was removed. Due to the slope and rockiness of the terrain BNSF was unable to remove additional soil. Several assessments were made to determine where contamination had spread and at what depth. Soil and groundwater samples were taken and groundwater monitoring wells were established.

Based on monitoring conducted at the site, it appears that the remaining soil is not a concern. Groundwater monitoring that previously showed varying levels of petroleum contaminants now meets state standards. No impact to the Marcus municipal water supply well has been detected.

Ecology proposes to remove the BNSF Marcus site from the Hazardous Sites List based upon the following:

- Review of independent cleanup reports submitted to Ecology.
- Supporting documentation.
- Work completed at the site meets state cleanup requirements.

Ecology also issued a letter to the property owner stating no further action is needed at the site.

You are invited to review the site-related documents and comment on the proposed removal from the Hazardous Sites List.

*Interim Action Work Plan Available for Public Review and Comment and Public Open House*

In August 2004, Ecology, Briggs Nursery, Inc., and Gary E. Briggs agreed to a Model Toxics Control Act (MTCA, Chapter 70.105D RCW) order to clean up contamination at the Briggs Nursery site in Olympia. Historical activities resulted in polychlorinated bi-phenyls

(PCB) and dieldrin release to soil. Since 2004, study and cleanup of contaminated soil has been ongoing in accordance with approved work plans. Investigation and cleanup is complete on all portions of Areas 1 and 2.

Ecology seeks public comment for the interim action work plan. The interim action will involve excavation of soils contaminated with dieldrin and PCB from within Area 3, on the east side of Henderson Boulevard. Removed soil will be taken to a landfill.

Steel tank, vessel, and beam fabrication have occurred at the site from 1941 until present. Past practices at the site have resulted in the contamination of soil, sediment, and groundwater at levels that exceed the Model Toxics Control Act (MTCA) cleanup standards for total petroleum hydrocarbons (TPH) and/or metals.

*Responsiveness Summary, Draft Consent Decree and Public Hearing*

The Whatcom Waterway site (Site) includes lands within and adjacent to the Whatcom Waterway in Bellingham Bay impacted by mercury and phenols historically released from industrial waterfront activities including:

- mercury discharges from the former Georgia Pacific Corporation's chloralkali plant
- wood waste and degradation products from historic log rafting activities
- phenolic compounds from pulp mill wastewater discharges
- other industrial releases

The majority of the Site is owned by the Port of Bellingham. They plan to develop a Clean Ocean Marina, including public access and habitat enhancements, in one area of the Site and to convert another area of the Site from a federal industrial waterway to a locally-managed multi-purpose waterway.

On October 10, 2006 Ecology issued the following cleanup documents for a 69-day public review period:

- Draft Supplemental Remedial Investigation/Feasibility Study (RI/FS) for the Whatcom Waterway site
- Draft Supplemental Environmental Impact Statement (DSEIS) for the Whatcom Waterway Site

162 oral and written comments received during the public comment period have been summarized and responded to by Ecology in a Responsiveness Summary. A number of the comments received on the RI/FS influence Ecology's development of future cleanup documents for the Site. However, since the comments do not significantly change the RI/FS, it is now considered final.

The final RI/FS and DSEIS, and public comments received on these documents have been used by Ecology to develop a draft Cleanup Action Plan (DCAP) which describes Ecology's proposed cleanup action for the Site. The DCAP is one of several exhibits to a legal agreement called a consent decree.

Ecology is proposing to enter into a consent decree with the Port of Bellingham (Port), the Washington Dept. of Natural Resources, the City of Bellingham, and Meridian-Pacific, LLC to implement the cleanup of the Site and to settle their liability. The draft Consent Decree includes the following exhibits:

- Exhibit A, Site Diagram: shows the Site location and vicinity
- Exhibit B, Draft Cleanup Action Plan: describes Ecology's proposed cleanup action for the Site
- Exhibit C, Schedule of Work and Deliverables: lists specific reports and actions required under the Consent Decree, along with the schedule for performance
- Exhibit D, List of Required Permits: describes permits that will likely be required for implementation of the cleanup

- Exhibit E, Applicable Substantive Requirements: lists regulatory requirements that Ecology will coordinate as part of implementation of the cleanup

- Exhibit F, Draft Public Participation Plan: describes opportunities for public involvement

The draft Consent Decree is available for public review and comment from July 12, 2007 through August 13, 2007. See information below regarding where to view the document and how to submit written comments.

A public hearing will be held on August 8, 2007, 6:30 p.m. - 9:00 p.m., at the Bellingham Cruise Terminal, 355 Harris Avenue, Bellingham, WA. This hearing is an opportunity to learn more about Ecology's proposed cleanup action, to ask questions, and to provide Ecology with comments.

Ecology will review all comments received and may make changes to the document as a result of them. If these changes are significant, a revised document will be made available for public review. If no significant changes are made, Ecology will issue final versions of the draft Exhibits and enter the Consent Decree in Whatcom County Superior Court. The cleanup will then move forward into design and permitting.

*Agreed Order for a Remedial Investigation and Feasibility Study*

Ecology proposes to enter into an Agreed Order with the Colfax Grange Supply Company, Inc., CHS, Inc., and Time Oil Co. These companies are identified as the potentially liable persons (PLPs) responsible for cleaning up site-related petroleum contamination. Two known petroleum releases have occurred at the site.

The North Colfax Petroleum Contamination site is approximately 1000 feet south of the Palouse River and east of the South Fork of the Palouse River. The site is made up of two facilities at different locations. One facility is the Food Mart 041, owned by Time Oil Co. located at 804 North Main Street. The other facility is part of the Colfax Grange Supply Company, Inc. located at 105 East Harrison Street. The Grange property includes an unattended fueling station called a cardtrol. The cardtrol is near the southeast corner of Tyler and North Main streets at 102 East Tyler, which is directly across the street from the Food Mart facility. The boundaries for the site may change depending upon where contamination is discovered during the remedial investigation.

The Agreed Order requires the PLPs to conduct a Remedial Investigation and Feasibility Study.

- Purpose of the Remedial Investigation: Conduct additional soil and groundwater sampling and analysis to determine the extent of contamination at the site.

- Purpose of the Feasibility Study:

Identify and evaluate cleanup options for soil and groundwater contamination.

- Contaminants of Concern: Petroleum product.

When a property owner applies to Ecology for review of their independent cleanup, the site enters the Voluntary Cleanup Program. After review, Ecology sends a letter to the property owner stating either that additional work is required to be removed from the list of hazardous waste sites or that no further action is needed.
