Enforcement Order for Remedial Action/ Feasibility Study and Interim Action Public Meeting August 22, 2007

Ecology has issued an Enforcement Order requiring the owners to cleanup soil and water contaminants at the Evergreen Aluminum smelter. The smelter stands on a larger facility site, amid support buildings and other land owned by Alcoa, Inc.

Evergreen's smelter operations (since 2002) added to existing soil and water contamination on the larger site. Both owners of the combined properties, known previously as "Alcoa Vancouver", and as "VANALCO", want to sell the property during year 2008, to the Port of Vancouver.

The enforcement order requires Evergreen to:

- Find, map, and list contaminants of concern at the smelter
- Design a site sampling strategy
- Identify applicable cleanup standards for the contaminants
- Develop a feasibility study
- After Ecology approval, perform those interim actions needed to ensure the

property complies with soil and water cleanup standards

The timing of this Enforcement Order serves community plans. Three areas of the property remain to be cleaned up:

- The original aluminum smelter (EVERGREEN) site
- Waster lagoon known as: the Columbia Marine Lines Site"
- The PCB-contaminated sediments (in the Columbia River) adjacent to the smelter.

The cleanup of the combined properties will allow ownership to pass to the Port of Vancouver in 2008.

Draft Cleanup Action Plan

The U.S. Navy has completed the draft final Cleanup Action Plan (CAP) for Operable Unit C (OU C) at Naval Base Kitsap at Bremerton and is now ready to finalize the CAP. The purpose of this plan is to make sure that the cleanup

solutions for the site continue to be protective of human health and the environment. The CAP has information on monitoring data for OU C groundwater sampling from 2002 to present. An Operable Unit is a management unit or area with similar contaminants that is designated for cleanup.

OU C is located in the north-central portion of Naval Base Kitsap, north of Decatur Avenue and northwest of Coghlan Road. Commercial and residential properties are located north, west and east and shipyard operations are located south of OUC in the Controlled Industrial Area (CIA) of the Puget Sound Naval Shipyard.

OU C is contaminated with total petroleum hydrocarbons (TPH) that are associated with the operation of former petroleum storage tank 317. Tank 317 was a concrete storage tank constructed in 1919 and was used to store No. 6 Fuel Oil, Bunker C. This fuel is technically any type of fuel oil used aboard ships. It gets its name from the containers (known as Bunker Tanks) on ships and in ports that it is stored in, called bunkers. Since No. 6 is the most common, "bunker fuel" is often used as a synonym for No. 6. No. 6 oil is very persistent, and does not degrade rapidly. Its viscosity and stickiness also make it very difficult to remediate underground contamination.

The Navy is now ready to finalize the CAP. This includes ongoing groundwater monitoring, institutional controls and groundwater sampling to continue the monitoring wells. The monitoring data shows that the TPH contamination is not flowing into the Sinclair Inlet.

Soil Safety Program Update: School and Childcare Soil Sampling and Soil Safety Actions

In 2005, the legislature passed a law (RCW 70.140) to keep children safe from soil polluted by arsenic and lead. Ecology created the Soil Safety Program (SSP) in response to this law. The program serves parts of King, Pierce, and Thurston counties affected by the Tacoma Smelter Plume.

Ecology has partnered with local health departments to provide free soil testing and outreach to schools and childcares. Ecology also provides free soil safety actions for play areas with elevated arsenic or lead, such as removing or covering polluted soil.

Currently:

- Evaluation and soil sampling at all 214 public and private schools in the program service area is complete.
- Ecology has completed soil covering

or soil removal and replacement at 11 schools and 1 childcare.

- Soil sampling is complete for 194 of 686 childcares in program service area.
- Fifty-two of the childcares tested will need action to remove or cover polluted soils.

Ecology and the local health departments will continue to work with schools and childcares to take the appropriate soil safety actions. Soil work is planned for a group of childcares this fall. Ecology will provide updates as the work progresses.

Interim Action Work Plan Available for Public Review and Comment and Public Open House

In August 2004, Ecology, Briggs Nursery, Inc., and Gary E. Briggs agreed to a Model Toxics Control Act (MTCA, Chapter 70.105D RCW) order to clean up contamination at the Briggs Nursery

site in Olympia. Historical activities resulted in polychlorinated bi-phenyls (PCB) and dieldrin release to soil. Since 2004, study and cleanup of contaminated soil has been ongoing in accordance with approved work plans. Investigation and cleanup is complete on all portions of Areas 1 and 2.

Ecology seeks public comment for the interim action work plan. The interim action will involve excavation of soils contaminated with dieldrin and PCB from within Area 3, on the east side of Henderson Boulevard. Removed soil will be taken to a landfill.

Negotiations for an Agreed Order

Ecology, the John J. O'Connell Disclaimer Trust, and Atlantic Richfield Company have begun negotiations to amend an Agreed Order to complete a Remedial Investigation and Feasibility Study (RI/FS) and draft Cleanup Action Plan (CAP) for the Industrial Petroleum Distributors site in Olympia. Historical

activities at a bulk fuel storage and distribution facility, which operated on the site from the 1950s to late 1990s, resulted in petroleum hydrocarbon contamination to soil and groundwater at levels above Model Toxics Control Act (MTCA) cleanup standards. Sediments may also be impacted. After a site hazard assessment, the site was given a ranking of 1 (greatest concern). The RI/FS and CAP for the portion of the site on the west side of West Bay Drive was finalized in March 2002. Implementation of the CAP occurred through Ecology's Voluntary Cleanup Program. The amended Agreed Order will specifically define the Site as including the area on the east side of West Bay Drive and require the completion of a RI/FS and draft CAP for this portion of the Site.

Agreed Order for a Remedial Investigation and Feasibility Study

Ecology proposes to enter into an Agreed Order with the Colfax Grange Supply Company, Inc., CHS, Inc., and Time Oil Co.

These companies are identified as the potentially liable persons (PLPs) responsible for cleaning up site-related petroleum contamination. Two known petroleum releases have occurred at the site.

The North Colfax Petroleum Contamination site is approximately 1000 feet south of the Palouse River and east of the South Fork of the Palouse River. The site is made up of two facilities at different locations. One facility is the Food Mart 041, owned by Time Oil Co. located at 804 North Main Street. The other facility is part of the Colfax Grange Supply Company, Inc. located at 105 East Harrison Street. The Grange property includes an unattended fueling station called a cardtrol. The cardtrol is near the southeast corner of Tyler and North Main streets at 102 East Tyler, which is directly across the street from the Food Mart facility. The boundaries for the site may change depending upon where contamination is discovered during the remedial investigation.

The Agreed Order requires the PLPs to conduct a Remedial Investigation and Feasibility Study.

- Purpose of the Remedial Investigation: Conduct additional soil and groundwater sampling and analysis to determine the

extent of contamination at the site.

- Purpose of the Feasibility Study:

Identify and evaluate cleanup options for soil and groundwater contamination.

- Contaminants of Concern: Petroleum product.

When a property owner applies to Ecology for review of their independent cleanup, the site enters the Voluntary Cleanup Program. After review, Ecology sends a letter to the property owner stating either that additional work is required to be removed from the list of hazardous waste sites or that no further action is needed.
