Site Proposed for Removal from Hazardous Sites List

Ecology invites you to comment on the proposal to remove the Saginaw Mill site from the Hazardous Sites List. Past operations contaminated site soil with diesel, oil-ranged total petroleum hydrocarbons, and formaldehyde. Formaldehyde was also found in site groundwater.

The site was cleaned up in 1999 and contaminated soil removed. 2006 testing found formaldehyde levels below state standards in groundwater. Test results show that the cleanup was successful.

Permit Modification Available for Public Review and Comment

Ecology welcomes comments on a draft dangerous waste permit modification for the Stericycle-Kent facility, formerly known as PSC-Kent.

Burlington Environmental LLC is the legal owner of the facility and is a wholly-owned subsidiary of PSC Environmental Services LLC, which is a wholly-owned subsidiary of Stericycle Environmental Solutions Inc.

Stericycle modified the dangerous waste (DW) permit for its facility in Kent. In accordance with WAC 173-303-830, the change is a Class 2 modification requiring Ecology's approval.

Stericycle has submitted a proposal to revise Parts A and B of the Stericycle-Kent facility DW permit to Ecology. These changes reflect construction upgrades and the proposed relocation of various operations to the Stericycle Tacoma facility. New construction will include firewalls, an expanded South Dock, and a concrete driving surface between the South Dock and the warehouse.

Several units will be removed from DW service. These include the South Check-In Area, Lab Pack Area, Lab Pack Container Storage Area, North and South Container Storage Areas, Central Process Area, and Solidification Process Area. No changes will be made to DW tank-related activities.

The modification also describes a change in facility name from "PSC-Kent" to "Stericycle-Kent."

A public meeting was held on July 29, 2015, at the Stericycle-Kent Regional Office, 18000 72nd Ave. S, Ste. 217, Kent.

Ecology proposes to issue a draft new agreed order for the PRS Group, Inc. site at 3003 Taylor Way in Tacoma. PRS receives and manages wastes from off-site generators. Activities conducted on site include: storage and treatment of used oil for resale, storage of

spent antifreeze for recycling, and treatment of wastewater for discharge to the local sewer utility. PRS also manages non-dangerous waste sludge for disposal at a Subtitle D landfill.

The agreed order requires PRS to:

- Sample and test groundwater quarterly from 9 monitoring wells for 1 year.
- Submit a data report to Ecology after the year of sampling.
- Compile groundwater data from past sampling events into one report for submittal to Ecology.

After the public comment period closes, Ecology will consider all public comments before issuing a final agreed order. Ecology will notify PRS, each person who submitted written comments, and those who requested notice of our decisions. The agreed Order becomes effective on the date Ecology signs it.

Ecology will conduct a public hearing if enough members of the public request one. To request a hearing, contact Charles Hoffman by phone, letter, or e-mail by the end of the comment period.

Consent Decree, Cleanup Action Plan, Other Documents Available for Public Review and Comment

Ecology invites the public to review and comment on the Ecology-prepared cleanup action plan for the Holcim Inc. site in Spokane Valley.

The plan is part of a legal agreement called a consent decree between Ecology, Holcim (US), Inc., and the City of Spokane Valley. Ecology is seeking comments on the consent decree and cleanup plan, along with a draft public participation plan and a draft Determination of Non-Significance under the State Environmental Policy Act (SEPA).

The cleanup action plan addresses contamination at the 24-acre site. The largest portion of the site is owned by Holcim (US), Inc. The remaining portions of the site are owned by the City of Spokane Valley and the Neighborhood Inc. Coyote Rock Development. The Centennial Trail runs adjacent to a portion of the site owned by the City. Holcim (US) Inc., Neighborhood, Inc., and the City of Spokane Valley are the parties responsible for cleaning up the site-related contamination. They are working with Ecology to cleanup cement kiln dust (CKD) and other contaminants at the Holcim Inc. site. The site is located along the Spokane River, above the Rathdrum Prairie-Spokane Valley Aquifer.

The remedial investigation will provide answers about contaminants in soil and groundwater, determine sources of the carbon tetrachloride and any other contaminants, and define where contamination is located at the site. The feasibility study will identify and evaluate the best methods to clean up the contamination.

In 2013, a remedial investigation report was written that provided detailed information of site-related contaminants in soil and groundwater. A feasibility study report was also developed that identifies and evaluates five cleanup options for the site-related contamination. These documents were available for public review in late 2013 and early 2014. Ecology used these documents to guide the development of the cleanup action plan. Ecology's proposed remedy is similar to the option preferred by the parties responsible for cleanup, but has some additional requirements.

The proposed remedy would require that CKD on the city property would be excavated and placed on the Holcim property with the Holcim CKD. The city property would be backfilled with clean soil and vegetated with appropriate native species. An engineered cap or cover would be placed on the CKD on the Holcim property. The cap would consist of the following layers, at a minimum, from the cover surface down to the graded CKD: Two feet topsoil, geotextile, one foot drainage material, and a geomembrane that is compatible with CKD with a minimum of 30-mil thickness, or a greater thickness that is commensurate with the ability to join the geomembrane material.

The cover system would be vegetated with native grasses (or other Ecology-approved surface treatment) and maintained for perpetuity, and would thus require a restrictive covenant be placed on the deed for the Holcim property. The estimated cost for this option is about \$2.5 million.

Model remedies now available for some soil cleanups

Revisions made to the MTCA statute in 2013 directed Ecology to place an increased emphasis on developing model remedies. Those revisions also allow Ecology to waive fees for cleanups that qualify for and appropriately use a model remedy.

The final version of “Model Remedies for Sites with Petroleum Contaminated Soils” becomes effective on September 1, 2015, and the document is now available at <http://www.ecy.wa.gov/programs/tcp/policies/model-remedies/index.html>.

As a matter of policy, we do not intend to charge fees for sites in the Voluntary Cleanup Program if they follow the criteria set forth in the guidance. Since using model remedies is new we will allow PLPs and consultants two attempts to meet the specified criteria before a fee will be charged for any further requests for assistance.

We have already started working on the next phase of the project, which will focus on “Petroleum Impacts to Groundwater.” We hope to have the scope of the effort developed by September and begin drafting the guidance later this fall.

GLOSSARY

Agreed order - A legal agreement with Ecology to make sure the cleanup meets the standards of Washington State's cleanup law, the Model Toxics Control Act (MTCA).

Cleanup action plan (CAP) - A document that describes the selected cleanup method(s) and specifies cleanup standards and other requirements. It is based on information and technical analyses generated during the RI/FS and consideration of public comments and community concerns. A draft of the CAP (DCAP) is made available for public review and comment before finalizing.

Comment period - A time period during which the public can review and comment on various documents and Ecology or EPA actions. For example, a comment period is provided to allow community members to review and comment on proposed cleanup action alternatives and proposed plans. Also, a comment period is held to allow community members to review and comment on draft feasibility studies.

Consent decree - A formal legal agreement that is filed with a court. It describes studies and/or cleanup work to be done at a site and the terms under which that work is to be done.

Engineering design report - Engineering design reports outline the specific details for implementation and operation of the first phase of the cleanup actions.

ERTS - Environmental Report Tracking System

Five-year periodic review - A periodic review is conducted at least every five years after the initiation of a cleanup action at a site, as required by the Model Toxics Control Act (MTCA). The purposes of the review are to evaluate site conditions, after cleanup is considered complete, and to ensure protection of human health and the environment.

Hazardous Sites List - A statewide list of contaminated properties. Ecology may remove a site from the list only after determining that all remedial actions except confirmational monitoring have been completed and compliance with the cleanup standards has been achieved at the site, or the listing was erroneous.

Independent cleanup action - Any remedial action without department oversight or approval and not under an order or decree.

LUST - Leaking Underground Storage Tank

NFA - No Further Action

Public participation plan - Outlines and describes the tools Ecology will use to inform the public about site activities, and it identifies opportunities for the community to become involved in this process.

PSI - Puget Sound Initiative

RCW - Revised Code of Washington

Remedial action - Construction work done to clean up a contaminated site.

Remedial investigation/feasibility study - Two distinct but related studies. They are usually performed at the same time, and together referred to as the "RI/FS."

RI/FS - See Remedial Investigation/Feasibility Study

SEPA - State Environmental Policy Act

Site Hazard Assessment (SHA) - An assessment to gather information about a site to confirm whether a release of hazardous substances has occurred and to enable Ecology to evaluate the relative potential hazard posed by the release.

UXO - Unexploded Ordnance

Voluntary Cleanup Program (VCP) - The VCP is one of several options for cleaning up a hazardous waste site under the state's

cleanup law. Under this option, property owners may perform a cleanup independently and request services from Ecology for a fee.

WAC - Washington Administrative Code

WARM, Washington Ranking Method - The method used to rank sites placed on the Hazardous Sites List.
